**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 10, SERIES OF 2022**

**IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF LINGAYEN  
UNDER ALERT LEVEL 2**

WHEREAS, Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) Resolution No. 161-A dated February 14, 2022, placed the province of Pangasinan under Alert Level 2 from February 16 to 28, 2022.

WHEREAS, every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare.

NOW THEREFORE, I, **LEOPOLDO N. BATAOIL**, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, hereby order as follows:

**ARTICLE I. GENERAL GUIDELINES**

**Section 1.** Minimum public health standards shall be implemented at all times. Such measures include, but are not limited to wearing face mask, washing of hands, maintaining physical distancing, installation of hygiene stations, and ventilation for enclosed areas.

**Section 2.** All persons are mandated to wear face masks whenever they go out of their residences, at the workplace, when entering government buildings, and while in public places.

**Section 3.** The use of face shields shall now be voluntary. However, the use of face shields shall be mandatory in medical, quarantine, and healthcare facility settings.

**Section 4.** In accordance with the national policy, the Municipality of Lingayen ensures unhampered movement by land, air, or sea of all types of goods and cargoes - including their personnel and delivery vehicles - to and from their destination regardless of alert level.

**Section 5.** There shall be a curfew from 10:00 p.m. to 4:00 a.m.

**ARTICLE II. OPERATIONAL CAPACITIES OF ESTABLISHMENTS**

**Section 6.** Casinos, horse racing, cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments shall not be allowed to operate, or be undertaken except as may be authorized by the IATF or the Office of the President.

**Section 7.** The following establishments, or activities, shall be allowed to operate, or be undertaken at a maximum of 50% indoor venue capacity for fully vaccinated individuals





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and those below 18 years of age, even if unvaccinated, and 70% outdoor venue capacity. Provided, that all on-site workers/employees of these establishments, or organizers of activities are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and minimum public health standards shall be strictly maintained.

- a. Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions (MICE);
- b. Permitted venues for social events such as parties, wedding receptions, engagement parties, wedding anniversaries, debut and birthday parties, family reunions, and bridal or baby showers;
- c. Visitor or tourist attractions such as libraries, archives, museums, galleries, exhibits, parks, plazas, public gardens, scenic viewpoints or overlooks, and the like;
- d. Amusement parks or theme parks;
- e. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys, skating rinks, archery halls, swimming pools, and similar venues;
- f. Cinemas and movie houses;
- g. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for basic education subject to prior approval of the Office of the President;
- h. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for higher education and for technical-vocational education and training;
- i. In-person religious gatherings; gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 and for the cremains of the COVID-19 deceased;
- j. Licensure or entrance/qualifying examinations administered by their respective government agency, and specialty examinations authorized by the IATF subject to the health and safety guidelines as approved by the IATF;
- k. Dine-in services of food preparation establishments such as kiosks, commissaries, restaurants, and eateries, subject to DTI sector-specific protocols;
- l. Personal care establishments such as barbershops, hair spas, hair salons, and nail spas, and those offering aesthetic/cosmetic services or procedures, make-up services, salons, spas, reflexology, and other similar procedures including home service options, subject to the sector-specific protocols of the DTI;
- m. Fitness studios, gyms, and venues for individual non-contact exercise and sports; Provided that patrons/clients and workers/employees wear face masks at all times and subject to DTI sector-specific protocols.





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- n. Film, music, and television production subject to the joint guidelines as may be issued by the DTI, DOLE, and the DOH;
- o. Contact sports approved by the LGU where such games shall be held;
- p. Funfairs/peryas or kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playroom, and kiddie rides;
- q. Venues with live voice or wind-instrument performers and audiences such as in karaoke bars, clubs, concert halls, and theaters; and
- r. Gatherings in residences with individuals not belonging to the same household.

**Section 8.** Establishments permitted to operate may be allowed additional venue/seating capacity on top of the existing allowable venue/seating capacities, as follows:

- a. An additional twenty percent (20%) if the Municipality of Lingayen has reached a vaccination coverage above seventy percent (70%) for both Priority Group A2 (senior citizens) and Priority Group A3 (adults with comorbidities), as determined by the Vaccine Cluster of the National Task Force Against COVID-19; and
- b. An additional ten percent (10%) if said establishments have been awarded Safety Seal Certificates under the Safety Seal Certification Program.

**Section 9.** Only hotels or accommodation establishments with valid DOT Accreditation shall be allowed to accommodate guests and clients subject to guidelines issued by the Department of Tourism and the IATF.

**Section 10.** Agencies and instrumentalities of the government shall remain to be fully operational and shall adhere to at least a 80% on-site workforce. Those assigned to work off-site shall be subject to alternative work arrangements as approved by the head of agency in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations issued by the Civil Service Commission (CSC). Heads of agencies providing health and emergency frontline services, laboratory and testing services, border control, or other critical services shall operate at a workforce beyond the minimum as may be necessary to deliver their mandates.

### ARTICLE III. CONTACT AND NON-CONTACT SPORTS

**Section 11.** Indoor and outdoor **contact sports** as a form of exercise are allowed. However, the holding of tournaments which may or may not attract crowds shall be prohibited.

**Section 12.** Indoor and outdoor **non-contact sports** are allowed. Provided, that where applicable, the minimum public health standards such as the wearing of face masks and the maintenance of social distancing, and no sharing of equipment, are observed.





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**ARTICLE IV. MODIFIED LIQUOR BAN**

**Section 13.** The sale, purchase, distribution, and drinking of alcoholic beverage in the confines of one's own home and in enclosed establishments that provide food and drinks is hereby permitted.

**Section 14.** The drinking of alcoholic beverage in other public places such as schools, workplaces, government facilities, unenclosed establishments that provide food and drinks, playgrounds, sports ground or centers, church grounds, health/hospital compounds, transportation terminals, markets, parks, resorts, walkways/sideways, entrance ways, waiting areas, and the like is still prohibited.

**ARTICLE V. CLEAN-UP DAY**

**Section 15.** The Lingayen Public Market and Municipal Slaughterhouse shall remain closed on Mondays for clean-up and sanitation. *Talipapas* situated in different barangays are also encouraged to observe a market holiday every Monday.

**ARTICLE VIII. PENAL PROVISIONS**

**Section 16.** Any violation of these Guidelines may be prosecuted under the appropriate local ordinance or as non-cooperation of the person or entities punishable under Section 9 par. (d) or (e), as the case may be, of Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act, and its Implementing Rules and Regulations.

**ARTICLE VI. EFFECTIVITY**

**Section 17.** This Executive Order shall take effect on February 16, 2022, and shall remain in force unless modified or repealed as circumstances warrant.
