EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 43, SERIES OF 2021

**IMPLEMENTING HEIGHTENED RESTRICTIONS IN THE
MUNICIPALITY OF LINGAYEN, PANGASINAN**

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 5, of the 1987 Constitution recognizes that the maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and property, and the promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy.

WHEREAS, under Article II, Section 15, of the 1987 Constitution, it is the policy of the State to protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 empowers local government units to exercise the powers which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare, health, and safety within their respective territorial jurisdictions.

WHEREAS, the undersigned issued Executive Orders Nos. 40,¹ 41,² and 42,³ Series of 2021 to abate the rise of COVID-19 cases in the Municipality.

WHEREAS, on August 27, 2021, Governor Amado I. Espino III issued Letter Circular No. 2021-0159 enjoining LGUs to implement emergency measures to address the recent spikes of COVID-19 cases in Pangasinan.

NOW THEREFORE, I, LEOPOLDO N. BATAOIL, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, and to supplement the measures contained in Executive Orders No. 40, 41, and 42, Series of 2021, hereby order the following:

1. Section 8 of Executive Order No. 41, Series of 2021, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 8. The following establishments, persons, or activities shall not be permitted to operate, work, or be undertaken:

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- a. Entertainment venues with live performers such as karaoke bars, bars, clubs, concert halls, theaters, and cinemas
 - b. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys, and similar venues;
 - c. Amusement parks or theme parks, fairs/peryas, kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playroom, and kiddie rides;
 - d. Casinos, horse racing, cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments, except as may be authorized by the IATF or the Office of the President for the purpose of raising revenue for the government; and
 - e. Outdoor sports courts or venues for contact sports, scrimmages, games, or activities.
 - f. Indoor sports courts and venues and indoor tourist attractions shall not be allowed to operate.
2. Meetings, Incentives, Conventions, and Exhibitions events and social events in venue establishments shall not be allowed.
 3. Aside from non-essential public gatherings, gatherings at residences with any person outside of one's immediate household shall likewise be prohibited. However, gatherings that are essential for the provision of health services, government services, or humanitarian activities authorized by the appropriate government agency or instrumentality shall be allowed.
 4. Religious gatherings shall be allowed up to thirty percent (30%) of the venue capacity.
 5. Gatherings for necrological services, wakes, interment, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 shall be allowed for a maximum of 3 days and up to thirty percent (30%) of the venue capacity. Serving of food and beverage is likewise discouraged.
 6. Visits to memorial parks, cemeteries, and columbaria shall be limited to not more than ten (10) persons per group and not exceeding thirty percent (30%) of the venue capacity.
 7. Dine-in within food preparation establishments such, as but not limited to commissaries, restaurants, eateries, fast food chains, cafes, and the like is prohibited





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from September 01 to 15, 2021, unless further extended as the circumstances warrant. Only take out, deliveries and drive thru are allowed during this period.

8. Personal care services such as beauty salons, beauty parlors, barbershops, and nail spas may operate up to thirty percent (30%) of venue or seating capacity. For this purpose, the establishments shall only provide services that can accommodate the wearing of face masks at all times by patrons/clients and service providers.

9. Outdoor tourist attractions, as may be defined by the Department of Tourism (DOT), shall remain to be allowed at thirty percent (30%) venue capacity with strict adherence to minimum public health standards.

10. To ensure compliance with strict physical distancing measures, supermarkets, public and private wet markets, grocery stores, agri-fishery supply stores, veterinary supply stores, pharmacies, drug stores, and other retail establishments engaged in the business of selling essential goods are enjoined to observe the specific daily schedule per barangay, as determined by the Market Supervisor and disseminated by the Municipal Information Office. For this purpose, barangay officials are directed to issue quarantine one (1) pass per household.

11. Videokes/karaokes outside the residence, or anywhere open to the public view are prohibited.

12. Public drivers, public commuters, employees of the government and private offices, and any persons entering commercial establishments such as but not limited to supermarkets, markets, banks, retail stores, and restaurants are required to wear face shields, in addition to face masks. Violators thereof shall be penalized under Provincial Ordinance No. 242-2020 or the applicable local ordinance.

13. A **NO MOVEMENT DAY** shall be observed every Monday to allow cleaning and disinfection of public places such as Market, Plaza, Parks, Beaches and others.

14. Barangay patrols are encouraged to maintain roving barkers to inform and remind people of pertinent Covid-19 regulations and to ensure compliance with this Executive Order.
